Presentation of Action Plan (PAP)

General Competition Information

- The Presentation of Action Plan's purpose is to creatively portray the relevance of the team's Action Plan in solving its Underlying Problem.
- Global Issues Problem Solving teams must present their Action Plan in order for their booklet to be considered for a GIPS award.
- The Presentation of Action Plan preparatory meeting will be held in each GIPS competition room immediately following the booklet writing. Coaches will be permitted to join their teams to receive pertinent information, including the mystery quotes and props.
- If there is a conflict with a team's presentation and a Community Problem Solving interview, the student(s) involved must choose to participate in either the CmPS interview or the team presentation.
- The **maximum number of participants is seven (7)**. In addition to the original team members, presentation teams may include individuals from other competitions, Affiliate Programs, and Mentored Regions.
- Senior division MAGIC competitors that choose to compete as a MAGIC team cannot also compete with teams from their Affiliate.
- Presentation of Action Plan awards will be presented to the first through fifth place teams in each division at Saturday's Variety Show.

Presentation Information

- A presentation is a two to four minute performance of the team's Step 6 - Action Plan.
- Presentations are prepared on Friday after the Global Issues Problem Solving competition and presented Friday afternoon, as scheduled.
- Top two teams from each competition room advance to final round on Saturday morning as scheduled.
- First place teams will present their Presentation of Action Plans at Sunday's Award Ceremony.

Resource List

Teams are responsible for bringing items on this list to IC for use in constructing props for the presentation:

- 1 roll of tape, any type
- pens and pencils
- 10 sheets of colored paper (approximately 9 x 13 in; 22.5 cm x 32 cm)
- 12 pipe cleaners
- 1 magazine
- 1 set of eight water-soluble colored markers
- 1 roll of paper towels
- 1 box of aluminum foil
- 1 plastic garbage bag (any size or color)

A pair of scissors, 1 stapler, and a box of staples may be used for the creation of props; for safety reasons these items may not be used as props during the presentation. Airline regulations require these items to be packed in your checked bags.

All props and costumes must be fashioned from the list of resources. Theatrical makeup is not an acceptable prop.

Evaluation

Purpose of Presentation of Action Plan evaluation

The purpose of Future Problem Solving Program International (FPSPI) evaluation is to provide coaches and participants with feedback that allows them to further develop and improve their problem solving skills. A team's Presentation of Action Plan (PAP) is performance-based, and evaluation is authentic assessment of the team's presentation. Because there is no single "right" answer, FPSPI employs a variety of strategies to review student work, using specific rubric-based criteria to evaluate performance.

Presentation of Action Plan evaluation at IC

- Presentations are scored separately from the GIPS written booklets.
- For first round competition, approximately 10 - 12 teams from the same division are randomly assigned to each presentation room.
- Two judges are assigned to each room for first round scoring.
- The top two teams from each room advance to the final round which is held on Saturday morning.
- Three judges are assigned to final round for each division; judges score a different division than scored in round one.
